 stoves
 cooking pots and utensils
 folding tables
 coolers
 lantern

What not to bring

electronics (cell phones, TVs, DSs, i-Touch, i-pad, etc)
 fireworks, bb guns, paint ball guns, sling shots
 fixed-blade knives or large folding knives
 pets
 tobacco
 alcoholic beverages
 firearms, archery equipment

Important features

heavy plastic
 footlocker works well
 warm weather sleeping bag
 rated to 20 degrees min for 3-season use
 gets you off the ground
 self inflating foam, foam, or air mattress
 small, synthetic
 easy on/off, slip-on
 with room for heavy socks, lots of walking
 2 pair
 at least 2 pair
 light weight, pockets
 zip off legs; put legs on if it rains
 couple of extra pair, synthetic better than cotton
 synthetic is better than cotton
 stuff with clothes for pillow
 waterproof, not just water resistant
 lightweight
 wind resistant
 full brim is best
 mounted on a flat plate

small 2AA size, headlamps work good
 for warm drink
 one to keep handy at all times
 travel size
 showers are available
 Be Prepared

SPF 30 or higher

Camp has Trading Post
 to the designated ASM
 collapsible, light weight
 band-aids, ointments, anti-itch cream
 Yours
 Don't lose it.
 Playing cards, chess set, checkers, horse shoes

2-man, canvas, on wooden pallets, no insect screen

Not sure of the ones at Skymont, but what I have seen before is sturdy metal frame with 2-3" vinyl-covered mattress.

 propane

propane

Why is it needed?

goes on tent floor to prevent things from falling through
 carry your stuff
 cheap, washable
 Padding; synthetic is quick drying
 sleeping comfort
 additional comfort on cot
 sleeping comfort
 for midnight toilet trips, etc
 make sure they are waterproofed
 quick dry, don't bring cotton
 quick dry, don't bring cotton
 warm weather
 quick dry, jeans are heavy and difficult to dry
 Cotton underwear + warm weather + walking = chafing
 warm weather, dries quick
 good place for dirty clothes
 rainsuits work better than ponchos
 don't sleep in your regular clothes (chiggers)
 mornings could be a little cool, could use rain jacket
 prevent sunburn
 compass course, available at Wal-mart, Academy

big lamps draw flying bugs
 can use a water bottle
 don't waste a lot of cups

quick dry; suggest 2 towels
 bath house should have some, but you never know
 sunburn, chapped lips

skeeters
 skeeters
 Suggest not more than \$50

optional, but more comfortable than picnic table
 minor cuts and scrapes
 A Scout is reverent.
 to get things signed off.

coffee, hot chocolate
 cook food
 cooking
 food storage
 more light than electrics (optional)
